


WHAT I AM LOOKING FORWARD TO ABOUT JOINING JMCC.....

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LIONHEART

Judgemeadow College is part of the Lionheart Educational Trust, a wider network of 14 schools across Leicester and Leicestershire, which will bring further opportunities throughout your time with us.

Being part of Lionheart means exploring together ALL aspects of your education. Your academic subjects like mathematics and English are incredibly important. What is EQUALLY important is your personal development, your health and well-being and your understanding of our core British Values.

Together, Lionheart students take opportunities to learn about these values and explore what respect, tolerance and equality mean.
